## Andrology in Latvia

The EAA would like to congratulate Dr Juris Erenspreiss, Director of the Andrology laboratory, Riga Stradins University, Latvia, on his recent achievement. Dr Erenspreiss has succeeded to include Andrology as an officially recognised sub-speciality (for urologists and endocrinologists) in his register.

A 2 year University residency program at the Urology clinic will be available from this autumn. The EAA feel that this is a great success and it could serve as another step stone in achieving recognition over Europe. It shows that individuals can make a difference and that a small number of Andrologists devoted to this aim in a given country can be enough.

After four enjoyable years as EAA President I feel the time has come for me to hand-over to a new president, in fact all the current executive officers positions are to be renewed and nominations are now invited from Academicians following the European Academy of Andrology statutes:

*4.3.4 Elect from the candidates the President, Secretary and Treasurer. Nominations for the officers must have been received by the secretary at least 8 weeks before the commencement of the General Assembly. All regular members can be nominated. The officers can be re-elected once at the discretion of the General Assembly. The elections are based on majority votes. If in the first counting no candidate receives the majority, the candidate receiving most votes in the second round shall be elected.*

*4.3.5 Elect from among the regular members by a majority vote of those present four individuals as members of the Executive Council with due regard to a geographical and scientific representation. Nominations are proposed at the General Assembly. Executive Council members will be eligible for a second term.*

### Milestones and special achievements

The April 2010 issue will be a special issue with the Proceedings of the 5<sup>th</sup> Copenhagen Workshop on Endocrine Disrupters, guest-edited by Dr Anna-Maria Andersson. This large issue will contain 22 papers (215 papers). Among them are two original studies that have been discussed in the international media, including BBC, thus giving IJA good exposure. Special recognition to all the Editorial teams—past and present. The impact factor has now reached a very impressive 4.021.

### EAA training centre accreditation

As reported in the last EAA newsletter EAA Training Centres will now be re-accredited every 6 rather than 4 years. This ongoing effort is being lead by the Accreditation Subcommittee, under the chairmanship of Prof Gianni Forti.

This year so far we have already performed the site visit in Ancona which was approved for three more years and there are four more site visits planned in Florence, Rome, Muenster, Copenhagen.

Recently accredited centres are: Tartu, Manchester, Ancona and Budapest. The centre in Gent has merged with another EAA centre in Belgium taking the total number of accredited sites to 23.

### European Congress of Andrology 2010 - Athens

The major event in Andrology this year will be the 6<sup>th</sup> European Congress of Andrology (ECA) to be held in the beautiful Mediterranean capital Athens from September 29<sup>th</sup> until October 1<sup>st</sup> 2010. The meeting will take place in the Megaron International Conference Centre centrally located in Athens within walking distance to vibrant streets with cafes, ouzerias, restaurants and bars, and only a short subway trip to the old quarter of Plaka, the Acropolis and the new Acropolis museum to name only some of the major attractions.

The ECA is organised by the Hellenic Society of Andrology with Prof. Dimitri Adamopoulos and Dr. Dimitri Goulis as chair and deputy chair of the local organising committee. The organisers have made every effort to keep the registration fee low (€ 350 for EAA Academicians if you register before 31<sup>st</sup> May 2010) to enable a wide participation rate.

The programme contains a hot topic session, the newly established International Journal of Andrology Special Lecture, the American Society of Andrology Special Lecture and a forum for young andrologists as some of the highlights. Of note, Academicians have played a major role in the programme with many of their suggestions incorporated to ensure a wide representation of interests.

## Andrology Education/Training

After the resignation of Professor Eberhard Nieschlag (Muenster, Germany) as the chairman of EAA Education Sub - committee, Professor Emmanuele Jannini (L'Aquila, Italy) and Professor Csilla Krausz (Florence, Italy) were appointed as co-chairs of the Education and Examination subcommittees respectively, supported by committee members, Gert Dohle (Rotterdam), Herman Tournaye (Brussels), Jolanta Hilczer-Slowikowska (Lodz), Gianni Forti (Florence), Gerd Heidl (Bonn) and Osvaldo Rajmil (Barcelona).

The Sub-committee, after a great deal of hard work and negotiations, has prepared a new single level 2 year Clinical Andrology training curriculum in conjunction with the European Association of Urological Andrology (ESAU) section of the European Association of Urologists (EAU) chaired by Professor Vincenzo Mirone (Naples, Italy). The curriculum will have four main areas of study: 1. Infection, 2. Sexology, 3. Endocrinology, 4. Infertility and contraception with a modular credit system being introduced. Clinical training will be complemented by approved training courses in Andrology

The new joint curriculum was approved by the EC of the EAA and the EAU recently. However, the EC of the European Society of Endocrinology chaired by Professor Eberhard Nieschlag declined to support the new EAA-ESAU joint Clinical Andrology training curriculum. The EAA will continue to work with the Urologists to implement the new joint training curriculum and representatives from both organisations will be meeting next month to plan the strategy. In the meantime, EAA training courses will be re-launched by the Sub-committee – currently a new programme is being drawn up.

EAA clinical Andrologist examination has also been accepted by the Urologists as the common exit examination for the EAA and ESAU joint educational curriculum. The new examination will be based on a combination of written – 30 multiple choice questions, and oral examination – which will be similar to the current format based on 4 clinical cases. Updating the contents (MCQs and new case materials) of the examination is a continuous process that will not be completed until 2011. In the meantime, the annual examination will continue in its present format. The examination board will consist of 5 EAA/ESAU members. The examination will continue to be held every year.



## EAA Funding and ISA young Andrologists award

As part of the an ongoing commitment to young Andrologists in our region the EAA will be supporting the International Society of Andrology's scheme to encourage, promote and recognise young (aged 35 and under) Andrologists in our region. Prof Andreas Meinhardt will be in touch with the EAA academicians and inviting suggestions for nominations for this award; the successful candidates will then be decided by the EAA Executive Council and invited to present at the 10th ICA 2013 - Melbourne

The EAA supported young researchers in 2008 by providing travel grants of 3 INYR speakers presenting their work in the young researchers section of The 5th European Congress of Andrology in Rome The EAA granted 5,000 euro for the sponsorship of a training workshop on Andrology which was held in Tunisia on the 9<sup>th</sup> October 2008.
