Reports from EAA-endorsed educational events

The 5th Andrology Symposium (11 September 2023), Zagreb, Croatia

The EAA Centre Zagreb, with the support of the Centre of Excellence for Reproductive and Regenerative Medicine (EU grant KK.01.1.1.01.0008.), organized the 5th Andrology Symposium. The Symposium covered a variety of andrology topics (i.e. foetal testis development genetics, 3D systems for spermatogenesis *in vitro*, epigenetic markers of non-seminomatous testicular germ cell tumours, predictive models for spermatozoa presence in biopsies of azoospermic men etc.). Apart from the local scientific community, the Symposium hosted two lecturers from abroad: Klementina Fon Tacer (*Director, Texas Center for Comparative Cancer Research (TC3R)*) and Monika Fijak (*PI, Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology, Justus-Liebig-University Giessen*). Especially notable

was the Young Ph.D. Session that encompassed a total of 7 short but exciting presentations of Ph.D. students. The Symposium ended with an informal gathering and a visit to Zagreb's upper town.

The 32nd Summer Academy: "Basics and clinics of human reproduction" and Symposium "Milestones in Andrology" (25-29 Sept 2023), Münster, Germany

This recurrent event was organised by Stefan Schlatt and Sabine Kliesch, the Directors of the Centre of Reproductive Medicine and Andrology, Münster University, which is also accredited as an EAA Training Centre. The on-site course covered the full spectrum of andrology, with the following topics of talks and seminars: biology and endocrinology of reproduction with focus on androgens, sexual differentiation, biology of germline stem cells, male and female (in)fertility, pre-implantation diagnostics, fertility preservation and ART, male and female contraception, sexual and erectile dysfunction, ageing in reproduction, genetic diagnosis of male infertility, semen analysis, epigenetics, andro-urological surgical procedures, transgender medicine, and bioethics in reproduction. The course was held in English and the faculty included recognised experts in the field from Germany and abroad.

The highlight of the event was the closing Symposium “*Milestones in Andrology: from Androgens to Sperm*” which was held in honour of Professor Ebo Nieschlag. The speakers reviewed the many illustrious achievements of Prof. Nieschlag, among which was his major role in the foundation of the EAA, and his service as the first President of the EAA. The EAA Executive Council was represented by President Hermann Behre, Secretary Ewa Rajpert-De Meyts, who summarised the history of the EAA, and Aleksander Giwercman, who presented an entertaining vision of the future of the field seen from his perspective of the current co-Editor of *Andrology*.

2nd ANDRONET-EAA School in Basic Semen Analysis, Stockholm

The second edition of the School was held in October (9-13 Oct 2023) at the specialized unit: Andrology, Sexual Medicine & Transgender Medicine (ANOVA) of Karolinska University Hospital and Karolinska Institutet, Stockholm, Sweden, one of the two EAA-Training Centers in Sweden. The programme of the School covered “*Theory and training in basic semen examination according to WHO 2021 and ISO 23162:2021*”, and the expert tutors were Lars Björndahl, and Magdalena Larsson Chatziantonis. In addition to the extensive lecture program, this School included ‘hands on’ laboratory exercises, hence, the attendance was limited to seven participants from Sweden and abroad.



Accreditation of EAA-training centres

Following a long break caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the EAA Accreditation Committee, now led by the immediate past President Csilla Krausz, has resumed activities with full force. We are pleased to announce the accreditation of a new EAA training centre in Doha (Qatar) and the re-accreditation of several other EAA centres.

New EAA-certified Andrology-training Centre in Doha

The Andrology and Male Fertility Unit at Hamad General Hospital in Doha (Qatar), directed by Dr Sami Al-Said (EAA Academician), has since 2022 sought formal accreditation as an EAA-Training Centre. The Unit’s medical staff includes two other EAA Academicians; Drs Mohamed M. Arafa and Ahmad Majzoub. The application from the Unit has been positively pre-approved by the EAA Accreditation Committee and the site visit by Professors Csilla Krausz (Italy) and Eduard Ruiz-Castañé (Spain) took place on 2 November 2023. Since then, the EAA Accreditation Committee and the Executive Council have approved their report and formally accredited the Unit in Doha as the EAA-Training Centre.

At this Newsletter's preparation time, the re-accreditation of 3 additional EAA Centres is pending: **the EAA Centre in Stockholm** (Sweden, October 2023, visitors Hermann Behre and Niels Jørgensen), **the EAA Centre in Thessaloniki** (Greece, November 2023, visitors: Francesco Lombardo and Eduard Ruiz-Castañé) and **the EAA Center in Copenhagen** (Denmark, December 2023, visitors Dirk Vanderschueren and Aleksander Giwercman. The accelerated re-accreditation program will continue in 2024.
