

Note from the President



Dear EAA members,

we are now approaching the end of 2016, a year full of scientific novelties and outstanding events. First of all, it was the year of our congress, held in Rotterdam. I would like to thank both the LOC and POC for organising such a successful meeting, with special thanks to the committee chairs, Professors Gert Dohle and Niels Skakkebaek. ECA 2016 also allowed us to continue with our traditional EAA/ ESAU/EBU courses, further strengthening our relationship with the European Association of Urology. In September, I signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the

President of the European Society of Endocrinology, Prof van der Lely. According to this agreement, the EAA became the official educational partner of ESE and therefore number actions are going to be carried out as part of our collaboration starting from May 2017.

This year we had a record number of applicants for the EAA Clinical Andrologist exam, clearly reflecting the constantly increasing interest of young MDs in our field. In order to promote education, we have increased the number of scholarships and travel grants available for young EAA members. The first edition of the EAA Ultrasound school finished in December with an exit exam. I would like to thank again the co-chairs of the school, Francesco Lotti (Florence) and Andrea Isidori (Rome) for their hard work and for having already organised the second edition for 2017. The EAA multi-disciplinary course on testicular cancer was the last educational activity of the year. The course was very well received by the participants from 9 countries (more details are given below). Another EAA school is planned for September 2017 at the EAA Center in Zagreb on "Testis Histology and Pathology for Clinical Andrologists and Embryologists".

It was also the year when the EAA accredited the first centers in Russia (Moscow) and in Croatia (Zagreb). The accreditation of the Moscow center took place after my last "Notes" from July, therefore I would like to welcome the Center Director, Prof. Oleg Apolikhin among the 27 EAA Center Directors. In September, an "EAA Center directors" meeting was held in Rotterdam, during which a number of strategic questions have been discussed. Among these were the preparation of joint research grants and COST actions in the frame of Horizon 2020. A grant proposal involving EAA centers has already been submitted by Prof Oliva, the co-chair of the EAA EU grant task force and a COST application is under preparation for 2017. I would like to remind you that the next International Congress of Andrology will be held in Copenhagen in May, and I hope to meet many of you at ICA2017!

As already announced in a previous communication, the successor of Prof. Ewa Rajpert– De Meyts and the co–Editor in Chief of our journal Andrology, is Prof. Manuela Simoni. I take the opportunity to thank Prof. Rajpert–De Meyts for her outstanding work both as the Editor in Chief of the International Journal of Andrology and subsequently as the co–Editor in Chief of Andrology.

Similarly to last year, the number of EAA members is steadily increasing and I warmly welcome all new members.

Update on Educational Courses

EAA Ultrasound School

The First Edition (2015–2016) of the EAA Ultrasound Course "Male Genital Tract and Penile Ultrasound", (Faculty: Francesco Lotti, University of Florence, Italy and Andrea M. Isidori, Sapienza University of Rome, Italy) has ended on the 30th of November. The final exit exam for the "EAA Ultrasound Course" certification held in Rome consisted of: a) a written test with multiple choice questions; b) a discussion on some ultrasound images; c) a hands-on practical part performed on a patient including a final written ultrasound response.







The Second Edition (2017) of the EAA US Course will start with a full day theoretical part held in Florence in January 2017. Report on the "EAA multi-disciplinary course on testicular cancer" (30 November-1 December, Rome, Italy) by **Andrea Isidori**

The EAA course on "Multidisciplinary approach to Testicular Cancer" organized by Andrea Isidori and Andrea Lenzi has been attended by 36 doctors and 21 professors from different specialties (endocrinologists, andrologists, oncologists, urologists and radiologists) coming from 9 different countries (Italy, Spain, Germany, Belgium, Denmark, Switzerland, Bulgaria, Russia, Greece). Faculty members and attendees came to Rome for a 2-day full-immersion listening and discussing the latest trends and guidelines on testicular cancer. Three EAA travel grants have been awarded to support attendees coming from abroad. All received an atlas text book on US of scrotal diseases and a pen-drive with 12 plenary lectures plus interactive clinical cases on different aspects of testicular cancer, offering an outstanding study material.

Multicentre Studies

EAA Multicenter Ultrasound Study: an update

The multicenter study "Standardization of male genital tract colour–Doppler ultrasound parameters in healthy, fertile men" (see http://www.andrologyacademy.net/studies.aspx) is progressing very well. So far, 216 subjects have been enrolled, 216 scrotal and 162 transrectal ultrasound have been performed, 184 blood samples have been collected. The goal is to finish the project collecting 200 transrectal ultrasound and blood samples.

Andrology, an update

Starting from January 2017, Prof. Ewa Rajpert–De Meyts will start her duty as the Chair of the Publications Committee, succeeding Prof. Ilpo Huhtaniemi. She was appointed by the EAA EC during the ECA 2016 Rotterdam. Report on the European Congress of Andrology (21-23 September, 2016, Rotterdam) by Gert Dohle

The ninth edition of the European Congress of Andrology (ECA2016) was organized in the modern city of Rotterdam, The Netherlands and hosted by the Andrology team of Erasmus MC. Almost 400 registrations from 46 different countries participated in this event. The scientific program was dedicated to male infertility issues (environmental and genetic aspects), male hypogonadism and male sexual dysfunction. The educational courses (in part organized with the ESAU) were well attended: among the topics discussed were infections and male infertility, Testis sparing surgery, Klinefelter syndrome, Peyronies disease, testicular sperm extraction methods, varicocele and azoospermia and hypogonadotrophic hypogonadism. Excellent state of the art lectures dealt with timely topics in Andrology, such as advanced paternal age and offspring, cryptorchidism/environmental factors and future fertility, genetics of male infertility.

More than 150 poster abstract were uploaded to the congress website and presented at 5 different poster sessions. The best poster from each session has been awarded during the closing ceremony. The 10 best abstracts were selected for oral presentation. The social program was dedicated to Antoni van Leeuwenhoek, the amateur scientist who first discovered spermatozoa in the seventeenth century. We visited the museum in the city of Delft where he lived and designed his hand held microscope. ECA 2016 was much appreciated by the participants, who enjoyed the friendly atmosphere and the well-designed scientific program by the program organizing committee, chaired by professor Niels Skakkebaek from Copenhagen, Denmark.
