A note from the President



Dear EAA Members,

Let me begin by expressing my deepest gratitude to all of you for giving me the opportunity to undertake my second mandate as the President of EAA. I have served our community in this important position since 2014 with the precious help of an excellent Executive Council composed of Dimitrios Goulis (Secretary), Hermann Behre (Treasurer), Gert Dohle, Andrea Isidori, Osvaldo Rajmil, Wolfgang Weidner, Jorma Toppari (Past President), Ewa Rajpert-De Meyts (2014-16, ex-Editor-

in-Chief, *Andrology*) and Manuela Simoni (since 2017, current Editor-in-Chief of *Andrology*). The new election, which took place in Budapest during the European Congress of Andrology (ECA 2018), led to the renewal of the Executive Council. The two new officers are Ewa Rajpert-De Meyts (Secretary) and Frank Tüttelmann (Treasurer), and the new Council members are Davor Ježek (Croatia), Zsolt Kopa (Hungary) and Eduard Ruiz Castañé (Spain).

Our Congress in Budapest (11-13 October 2018) was a special event, not only because it was the 10th ECA but also because it coincided with the 25th anniversary of the EAA. For this occasion, I edited a commemorative book to offer you insights into the history of the EAA and summarize the achievements of the Academy. The electronic version of the EAA book is now available on the Academy's website. On the occasion of this special anniversary, some of our Academicians have been honoured for their outstanding contributions to the EAA: Eberhard Nieschlag, Ilpo Huhtaniemi, Jorma Toppari, Ewa Rajpert-De Meyts and György Papp.

For the second time, a meeting of the Directors of EAA Training Centres took place just before ECA 2018, allowing an open discussion on EAA educational strategies. The training centres are the backbone of the EAA and indeed, they were promoters of the outstanding EAA activities, such as educational courses and summer schools. I am proud to announce that this year we had the largest ever number of applicants for the EAA Clinical Andrologist examination, clearly reflecting the constantly increasing interest of young MDs in our field and the excellent work carried out in the EAA centres. These activities resulted in a growing number of EAA Members and I warmly welcome all the new Members. To promote education, we have increased the number of scholarships and travel grants available for young EAA Members.

ECA 2018 was a remarkable success with a record number of participants from more than 50 different countries. ECA represents a unique scientific forum in Europe, entirely dedicated to all aspects of andrology, thus providing a platform for interaction between clinical andrologists with different backgrounds (endocrinology, urology, gynaecology and dermatology) and basic/translational scientists. A significant number of non-European delegates attended the Congress. Their presence underlined the fact that the EAA Congress is the leading biennial scientific event not only for European andrologists.

My sincere gratitude goes to the Chairman of the Local Organising Committee, Zsolt Kopa and his team, who have organized this meeting with great dedication, giving all attendees an unforgettable ECA 2018. I would also like to thank the Members of the Programme Organising Committee, chaired by Dimitrios Goulis, with vice-Chairmen Giovanni Corona and Rafael Oliva, for the excellent scientific programme which has been highly appreciated by the attendees. At the ECA 2018 we have further strengthened our collaboration with the ESAU by organizing 3 joint EAA/ESAU courses. In this regard, I would like to thank the Chairman of ESAU, Professor Nikolaos Sofikitis for his support.

Finally, it is my pleasure to inform you that our next ECA will take place in Münster in early December 2020 and will be held together with the 12th International Congress of Andrology (ICA).

We are now approaching the end of 2018, a year full of scientific breakthroughs and outstanding events. I am confident that 2019 will be a busy and productive year and will bring a series of new activities. I would like to involve all of you in this innovating process, hence you are welcome to send your suggestions to the EAA Secretary and Executive Council, before the next meeting of the Executive Council takes place in January 2019.

Summary of the European Congress of Andrology ECA Budapest 2018



The 10th ECA was the main **highlight of the year** and a resounding success. The meeting was organized by the Hungarian Andrology Society, with Prof. Zsolt Kopa leading a very efficient Local Organising Committee, which included representatives from major andrology centres across Hungary (Mátyás Benyó, István Király, Tamás Körösi, István Lantos, György Papp, Gábor K. Rosta, Zita Soós). The location of the congress venue in the centre of Budapest, the beautiful capital of Hungary, has undoubtedly added to the special atmosphere and attracted many participants from all corners of the world. The turn-out broke the ECA records: close to 500 participants from 52 countries attended the congress.

The opening ceremony was a special celebration of **Hungarian andrology**, embodied by three personalities: the main organizer of the Congress: Prof. Zsolt Kopa, his mentor and ‘the father’ of Hungarian andrology, Prof. György Papp, and the current President of the EAA, Csilla Krausz. Hungary is also among very few countries that acknowledge andrology as a medical specialty.

The **excellent scientific program** of the Congress has been put together by the experienced and multidisciplinary Programme Organising Committee (POC): Dimitrios Goulis (Greece, Chairman), Giovanni Corona (Italy, Vice-Chair for Clinical Science), Rafael

Oliva (Spain, Vice-Chair for Basic Science), Alberto Ferlin (Italy), Aleksander Giwercman (Sweden), Sabine Kliesch (Germany), Maaris Laan (Estonia), Roger Miesusset (France) and Dirk Vanderschueren (Belgium). The programme was considered by many among the best ever, and included a broad selection of topics, such as male infertility (clinical and genetic aspects), spermatology, endocrinology with focus on hypogonadism, fertility preservation, onco-andrology, testis biology, diagnostics and imaging in andrology, erectile dysfunction, and transitional andrology. According to the tradition, the ECA was preceded by a comprehensive educational course for clinicians, with excellent lectures given by the members of the POC.

At the Congress, most of the excellent state-of-the-art lectures were presented as lively *Pro* and *Contra* debates focussing on controversial issues, including endocrine disruptors, late-onset hypogonadism, sperm DNA integrity testing, and early endocrine treatment of Klinefelter syndrome. An important symposium was devoted to new EAA clinical guidelines, with lead authors presenting consensus on the management of bone health in andrological patients, management of oligo-astheno-teratozoospermia, and gynaecomastia in adult men.

Interaction with other societies was reinforced by exchange lectures; the **ESE lecture** delivered by Manuela Simoni and the **ASA lecture** presented by Don Conrad (USA), as well as three dedicated ESAU sessions with focus on andrological urology.

More than 180 abstracts have been submitted to ECA, and 20 best abstracts were selected for oral presentations, including one session

organised by the network of **young researchers in andrology (NYRA)** (picture).

160 posters were presented in two well-attended poster sessions. All abstracts were published in a special October 2018 issue of *Andrology* and are also available for all members on the EAA website.

The social program treated the delegates with two events: a pleasant welcome reception with a bit of Hungarian folklore presented by a local dance company, and

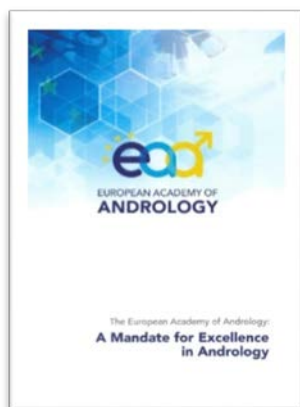
a wonderful banquet held on a large boat *Spoon*, moored at the shore of Danube, with beautiful night views on the historic buildings flanking the river. The scientific highlights and pleasant social memories of ECA 2018 will for sure stay long with the participants.

and Ewa Rajpert-De Meyts (former Chief Editor of *Int. J. Androl.* and *Andrology*).

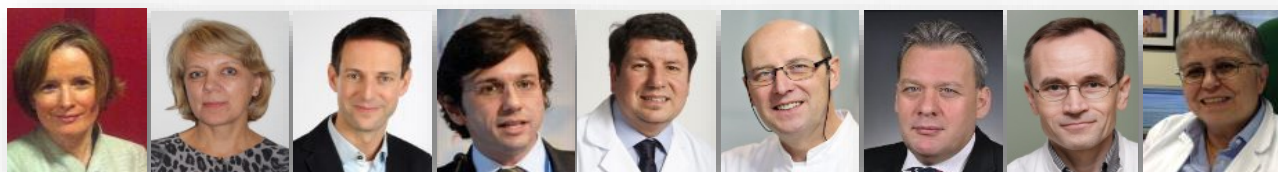
Renewal of the EAA Executive Council

EAA Scholarships

Two scholarship grants (1500 € each, one generously supported by Bayer), were awarded to two EAA members to perform a research project or specialised clinical training in an EAA training centre abroad. The scholarship recipients in 2018 are:



Dr Leen Antonio, EAA affiliated member from Leuven University (B), directed by Prof. Dirk Vanderschueren. She wished to travel to the EAA Centre at Rigshospitalet in Copenhagen (DK) to perform a combination of research and training under the supervision of Dr Niels Jørgensen. She will investigate a possible association between bone mineral density and semen quality, and train in standardization and development of specific patient trajectories for infertility, gynaecomastia and Klinefelter syndrome.



Dr Andrea Sansone, EAA affiliated member from Sapienza University of Rome (Italy) who will conduct several research studies at the Centre for Reproductive Medicine and Andrology in Münster (Germany), directed by Prof. Stefan Schlatt. Dr Sansone will be given access to substantial databases and biobanks in Münster and will performed some analytical measurements. The focus of his research will be on hormonal changes in andrological patients, including patients with germ cell neoplasms.

News from the journal



Our official journal, *Andrology*, edited jointly by Manuela Simoni and Douglas Carrell, is close to complete its 6th year of existence. A positive development was an increase in the Impact Factor to 2.74, but more work has to be done to reach the top position in the field. Among the strategies discussed at the meeting of the Editorial Board held in Budapest, is an increased effort to publish thematic issues. The journal is currently considering papers for two such issues: on epididymis and testicular cancer (basic and clinical aspects).

The Editors are adamant to accept only papers of high quality. One of such articles was given an annual *Andrology* award for the best paper published in 2017: Jenkins TG, James ER, Alonso DF, Hoidal JR, Murphy PJ, Hotaling JM, Cairns BR, Carrell DT, Aston KI. *Cigarette smoking significantly alters sperm DNA methylation patterns*, *Andrology* 2017;5(6):1089-1099.

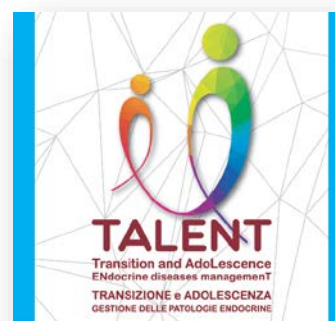
